1. Social Development Practice In a Globalizing World *

June 6-8, 2007

Course Fee: P3,000.00

Coordinator: Dr. Erlinda Natulla

This is an updating training for people who desire to reflect back on their experiences / practices in social development and to gain an updated in-depth framework for such engagement. Training participants will also polish their know-how in social analysis, social assessment, clarifying, practice perspectives, and planning further intervention for facilitating social development processes. In this training, social development as planned and practiced will be contextualized within our globalizing realities.

2. International Social Work *

January 30, 31, February 1, 2007

Course Fee: P3,000.00

Coordinator: Dr. Juliet Bucoy

This course will prepare students in international social work practice **LOCALLY AND INTERNATIONALLY**. It will cover four major components: 1. philosophy, principles, framework in human and social development; 2. critical issues and problems in global context; 3. the person in international practice and 4. enhancing and sharpening needed competencies of the practice.

The course shall broaden social work perspectives in terms of international realities and issues. It shall further develop the necessary competencies of Social Work practitioners for a meaningful engagement with international organizations /groups.

3. Project Planning & Development *

February 6-8, 2007

Course Fee: P3,000.00

Coordinator: Prof. Gil Alonsagay

At the end of the course, the participants shall be able to understand and appreciate the nature and concept of a project, work out the various stages of the project cycle, and learn the tools and skills in preparing a project proposal.

4. Values Development *

February 13-16, 2007

Course Fee: P3,000.00

Coordinator: Prof. Erlinda Acierto

A psychological study of the growth and development of the self in relation to others, life, the world and God. It enables the participants to acquire an understanding of the self through the basic dynamics involved in the shaping of human consciousness and values development. It also tackles psychological principles relevant to the task of facilitating pastoral care for socio-psychological spiritual maturity.

5. Fundamentals of Econometrics

February 22-24, 2007

Course Fee: P3,000.00

Coordinator: Prof. Gil Alonsagay

A 3-day seminar designed to equip participants with the basic but functional knowledge and skills on how to apply econometrics on various observational-type data in order to come up with a more accurate forecast on the behavioral tendencies suggested by said data. These observational-type data may belong not only to economics but to other social science disciplines as well, as has been demonstrated in advanced countries like the U.S.A. Thus, this seminar is practically useful to students and thesis advisers (college and master's level) of social sciences, faculty, and professional researchers.

6. Appreciating Basic Financial Statements

February 23, 2007

Course Fee: P1,500.00

Coordinator: Ms. Melba Matula

This course is designed for heads/department heads of NGOs, cooperatives and other organizations who want to understand the significance of the basic financial reports (namely the Balance Sheet, Income Statement and the Cash Flow Statement), how they are related to each other, and how these reports can be used as effective tools for management.

7. Teaching Children on the Proper Attitude and Use of Money

February 27-28, 2007

With parents, teachers, advisers, and all those involved in children's welfare as target clientele, this course explores the participants' values, attitudes, and behavior toward money and other material possessions. Participants learn various strategies and techniques to help children learn proper attitudes and behaviors on the nature, use, acquisition and handling of money. Activities and tips on encouraging children to spend, save, and invest money wisely are also included.

8. New Way of Being Church, Doing Theology and Pastoral Planning *

March 7-10, 2007

Course Fee: P3,000.00

Coordinator: Msgr. Manuel Gabriel

Specially designed for Parish and Diocesan lay church workers and priests as well as members of religious congregations. Expounds on the paradigm of integral evangelization.

Elaborates on the imperatives of the PCP II (Second Plenary Council of the Philippines) from the socio-cultural perspective.

Provides hands-on training (via workshop) to participants.

9. Training for Community Extension/Outreach Program Coordinators & Workers

March 27-29, 2007

Course Fee: P3,000.00

Coordinator: Dr. Erlinda Natulla

The training is designed for implementers, supervisors and managers of community outreach programs of schools/colleges/universities and other institutions/organizations. It will provide participants with a proactive framework for involvement with communities needing helping interventions. Alternative outreach program models will also be taken up. Know-how in designing a program evaluation scheme will be the content of the final workshop.

10. Creation Appreciation for Children and Youth

April 17-19, 2007

This course fosters appreciation of God's gifts as manifested in the beauty and wonder of His creation. Participants are guided to develop confidence in expressing and accepting their own giftedness and are encouraged to harness their creative talents through different art forms of creation as manifestations of God's love for us, and ourselves as co-creators.

11. Institutional Self-Evaluation

April 20-21, 2007

This three-day course deals with the process of institutional self-evaluation using the framework of institutional and program evaluation towards quality assurance and voluntary accreditation. It will adapt a framework focusing on the vision-mission-goal of a given institution touching on the different areas of internal efficiency and external productivity. It is primarily aimed to prepare the institution for the various levels of accreditation.
